Year 3 are extending the links between Christmas and English by getting immersive with the Polar Express. Now that we have completed this book along with writing activities based on the lovely story, we are going on our own train trip to find Santa. All classes are getting dressed up in our PJs and catching the train from Newquay to Luxulyan. Today, the first of the Year 3 classes went on the trip; they discovered Santa in the Village Hall, waiting with hot chocolate and party games: he also read The Polar Express to the children and joined in the fun as well.









During this half term, Year 4 immersed themselves in a Roman day – with a visitor who taught them about: culture, clothing and food. They then continued their learning through computing and music.

They have also enjoyed exploring volcances across the curriculum; reading and writing about Escape from Pompeii in English, connecting this to their learning in geography and then creating their own volcance in design technology.

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YEAR 5

'The Kid Who Came from Space'

Year 5 classes have studied the impact of maths and economics in everyday life, using the great online resources from NatWest.

In their science lessons, there have been lots of hands-on activities with pupil led investigations, involving levers, air resistance and upthrust in water.

They have also been reading a brilliant book 'The Kid Who Came from Space' in their VIPERS reading sessions that ties up their curriculum study of Space this term. Year 5 have loved the intergalactic adventure which starts at home with Ethan, who discovers that his twin sister has been abducted by aliens!





YEAR 6 Victorians

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Pupils embarked upon an educational walk around Newquay with Len Shepherd, a local historians. He took us around Newquay, following the tramline, explaining the Victorian features of the town along the way and what impact tourism had on Newquay in Victorian times. The children were able to understand how decisions made well over one hundred years ago, still resonate and have an influence on how the town is developing to this day.

We have also been looking at the artwork of Victorian artist and designer William Morris. The children have studied his designs, looking at the symmetry and repetition he uses. The pupils have created their own designs and recreated them through print.

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We attended an Indoor Athletics event at NQY Sports Centre hosted by <u>Newquay Tretherras</u>. It was wonderful to see so much talent and enthusiasm from all the schools who attended.

Our pupils worked hard throughout and were delighted to finish in joint 1st place alongside a talented team from <u>Goonhavern Primary</u> <u>School and Preschool</u>.

A big shout-out to the Sports Leaders from <u>Newquay Tretherras PE</u> for facilitating the event.


