INTENT

Pupils will learn to recognise their self-worth and identify positive things about themselves and their achievements

Pupils will learn and talk about their rights and responsibilities as a member of their class, school, wider community and the country they live in.

Pupils will learn about the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child and that these are not met for all children worldwide.
